The program provides property tax abatement for new construction or for the rehabilitation of residential, commercial or industrial structures within pre-designated areas.

The program provides a matching grant of \$10,000 to \$40,000 to reimburse eligible expenses associated with a comprehensive facade improvement. Building owners are required to provide a 50% match and must either occupy the space as a business owner or actively market the space for lease.

The program provides a matching grant of \$25,000 to \$50,000 for first-floor, interior renovation expenses. Building owners are required to provide a 33% match and must either occupy the space as a business owner or actively market the space for lease.




